

Whereas William B. King, Barney M. McHenry, and John W. Lapsley,  
of Dallas County Alabama, have deposited in the General Land  
Office, of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the  
Land Office at Tuscaloosa, whereby it appears that full pay-  
ment has been made by the said William B. King, Bar-  
ney M. McHenry and John W. Lapsley, according to the provi-  
sions of the Act of Congress of the 2d<sup>nd</sup> of April 1820, entitled  
"An act making further provision for the sale of the Public  
Lands" for the fourth West quarter of the South West quarter  
of Section Seven in Township Twenty one, of Range three  
West in the District of Lands subject to sale at Tuscaloosa  
Alabama containing thirty nine acres and thirty nine and  
a half hundredths of an acre, according to the official  
plat of the survey of the said lands, returned to the General  
Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has  
been purchased by the said William B. King, Barney M. Mc-  
Henry and John W. Lapsley, Now Know ye, That the United  
States of America in consideration of the Premises and in  
conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case  
made and provided, Have Given and Granted and by  
these presents do give and grant unto the said William  
B. King, Barney M. McHenry and John W. Lapsley, and to  
their heirs, the said tract above described; to Have and  
to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges

immunities, and opportunities of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said William B. King, Barney M. McHenry and John W. Laphay, and to their heirs and assigns forever, as tenants in common and not as joint tenants.

In Testimony Whereof, Millard Fillmore President of the United States of America, has caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
