

The State of Alabama. } Whereas an execution issued
Shelby County. } from the County Court of Shelby
County against J. G. Davis in favor of W. G. McLean Com-
pany, a corporation, on a judgment rendered in
said Court on the 19th day of December 1912, for
the sum of one hundred fifty and no Dollars, besides
costs of suit, which said execution came into

my hands as Sheriff of said County on the 17th day of April 1915, to execute and return according to law, by virtue of which said execution I did as Sheriff aforesaid levy upon the following as the property of the said J. G. Davis to wit:

Southwest $\frac{1}{4}$ of North East $\frac{1}{4}$, South East $\frac{1}{4}$ of North West $\frac{1}{4}$, North East $\frac{1}{4}$ of South West $\frac{1}{4}$, North East $\frac{1}{4}$ of North West $\frac{1}{4}$ & North West $\frac{1}{4}$ of North West $\frac{1}{4}$, all in Section Twenty six (26) Township Twenty (20) Range one (1) West, situated in Shelby County, Alabama. of which said levy there and there notice was given the defendant (personally and after giving notice of the time, place and terms of sale by advertisement once a week for three successive weeks in the Shelby County, then a newspaper published in Columbiana in said County and also by giving thirty days ^{previous} notice of the time, place and terms of sale by posting advertisement thereof at the Court House door of said County said property so levied on was offered for sale at the Court House door of said County between the legal hours of sale on the 2nd Monday in May, that being the 10th day of May 1915, at which said sale R. G. Weldon became the purchaser of said property so levied on as aforesaid for the sum of Two hundred fifteen & ^{no} Dollars, he being the highest, best and last bidder for the same.

Now therefore know all men by these presents, that in pursuance of the premises for and in consideration of the said sum of Two hundred fifteen & ^{no} Dollars to me in hand paid by the said R. G. Weldon, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged & J. H. Fulton as Sheriff of said County do hereby sell, convey, transfer and set over to the said R. G. Weldon, all the title, interest and claim which the said J. G. Davis had, held and owned in and to the foregoing described premises as fully and completely in all respects and might, could or right to convey the same under and by virtue of the power and authority vested in me in the premises and by the statutes for such cases provided. To have and to hold unto the said R. G. Weldon

heirs and assigns forever.
