 Whereas in pursuance of the Act of Congress approved
 September 28th 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land
 to certain officers and soldiers who have been engaged
 in the Military Service of the United States" warrant
 No. 32309 for 80 acres issued in favor of Philip
 Campbell, Private in Captain Woods Company South
 Carolina Militia Nov 1812, has been returned to the
 General Land Office with evidence that the same has
 been duly located upon the South-West quarter of the
 North-East quarter and the North-West quarter of the
 South-East quarter of Section twenty nine in Township
 Twenty one of Range three West, in the District of Lands
 subject to sale at Tuscaloosa Alabama containing sev-
 enty nine acres and sixty four hundredths of an acre
 according to the Official Plat of the Survey of said
 Lands returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor
 General, which has been assigned to John M. Moore,
 now known as, that there is therefore granted by the
 United States unto the said John M. Moore, the tract
 of Land above described: To have and to hold the said
 Tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof unto
 the said John M. Moore and to his heirs and assigns
 forever: In Testimony Whereof I James Buchanan Presi-
 dent of the United States of America have caused
 these Letters to be made Patent and the seal of
 the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed
 Given under my hand at the City of Washington
 the second day of April in the year of our Lord
 one thousand eight hundred and fifty seven and
 of the Independence of the United States the eighty
 first,
