 1915, by and between the Town of Montevallo, a
 municipal corporation, party of the first part and the
 Alabama Girls Technical Institute a public corporation
 party of the second part, Witnesseth:

That for and in consideration of the conveyance
 by said party of the second part to said party of the
 first part, of a certain lot in said town, in trust
 for the purposes of a public school for the white
 race, and the dedication of certain streets in said
 town by said party of the second part, all as more
 particularly described and set forth in the deed
 conveying and dedicating the same, bearing even
 date with this indenture, and which is hereby re-
 ferred to for particular description, said party of
 the first part has granted, bargained and sold
 and does hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto
 said party of the second part, the following describ-
 ed real estate lying and being situate in said

town of Montevallo, County of Shelby, and State of Alabama to wit: All that parcel of land which heretofore composed and comprised that part of North Boundary Street, which lies and extends northwest of Oak Street according to the original plan of the town of Montevallo, as recorded in the Probate office of said Shelby County; also all that parcel of land which heretofore composed and comprised that part of King Street which lies and extends between North Boundary Street and the new street dedicated by said party of the second part to connect Oak with King Street, by said deed of conveyance hereinbefore referred to; also all that parcel of land heretofore composing and comprising that part of King Street which lies and extends between the northwest line of Highland Street, if said line were projected across King Street, and the southwest line of Black Street if said line were projected across King Street; also triangular Blocks or Lots "C" and "E" Lyman's Addition to the Town of Montevallo, all according to and as shown by the survey and map of said Lyman's Addition, as recorded in the said probate office of Shelby County, the said parts of streets and said Blocks, or Lots, heretofore used by said town as public streets and parks, having been vacated, abandoned and abolished as such, by ordinances, approved May 10, 1915.

To Have and to hold, the foregoing premises together with all and singular the rights, privileges and hereditaments thereunto belonging or appertaining unto said party of the second part its successors and assigns in fee simple forever. In Testimony Whereof said party of the first part has caused its corporate name to be hereunto signed by its Mayor O. J. Howell who is duly authorized thereunto by ordinance A-4, of said Town approved May 10, 1915, and ordinance A-5, of said Town approved May 1915, and its corporate seal to be hereto affixed and duly attested by its clerk on this the day and date first above written.
