 who being by me first duly sworn deposes and says
 That I am acquainted with the following lot or parcel
 of land in the town of Calera, Shelby County, Alabama,
 viz: The East 80 feet of Lot 457 and east 80 feet of
 the south half of Lot 456 of the survey made by
 N. B. Darc for the Shelby Lumber Company in 1869, being
 a lot fronting 70 feet on the west side of Montgomery
 Avenue and running back along the north side of
 Patton (sometimes called Church) Street 80 feet.
 That I bought this lot with other property adjoining
 from J. C. McElroy in the year 1894 and conveyed
 a $\frac{3}{4}$ interest in the same to my brother J. D. Wade
 in 1899 and purchased said interest back during
 the year 1901. That in March 1912 I sold and conveyed
 the said lot to D. R. Shaw who conveyed the same
 to E. C. Kinney in August 1914.
 That when I first bought the lot from McElroy I im-
 mediately took possession of the same and a few
 years afterwards built on said lot and continued
 possession of said lot until I conveyed to J. D. Wade
 when I continued in possession of the same un-
 til I purchased the same back from him, and then
 I continued in possession of the same still until
 I sold and conveyed the said lot to D. R. Shaw
 when he immediately took possession of same
 and continued in said possession until he
 conveyed said lot to E. C. Kinney.
 That the said possession from my first purchase
 to my last conveyance of said lot was an entire
 untroubled possession was notorious, peaceable and
 adverse possession; and that no dispute was

ever made to the said title or possession and no adverse claim was ever set up against the property as far as I know or could learn.
