

State of Alabama, I, H. E. Walker and wife Mary Walker  
County of Shelby,) for and in Consideration of the sum of  
Twenty & Two Dollars (\$22.00) to me in hand paid by Alabama  
Power Company, a Corporation the receipt whereof is ac-  
knowledged, do hereby grant to said Alabama Power Company  
its successors and assigns the right to construct, operate,  
and maintain its lines of poles and towers as located  
by the final location survey heretofore made by said  
Company for the transmission of electric power with the  
right to strung thereon from time to time lighting power  
and telephone wires upon, over and across the following  
described land situated in Shelby County, Alabama:  
The Northwest Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of Section Thirty-  
Five, Township Twenty South, Range Three West, the median line  
being understandably described as follows: Beginning at a  
point on the South boundary of the Southeast Quarter of  
said Section Thirty-five, Township Twenty South, Range  
Three West, said point being North 23 degrees and 57  
minutes East 2740 feet (more or less) from a point on the  
South boundary of the Northwest Quarter of Section Two, Town-  
ship Twenty One South, Range Three West, said last named point  
being West 370 feet from the South east corner of the North  
West Quarter of said Section Two, running thence from  
said point of beginning North 23 degrees and 57 minutes  
East to a point on the East boundary of the Southwest Quarter  
of the Southeast Quarter of said Section Thirty-five, Township  
Twenty South Range Three West - It is understood and agreed  
that the Alabama Power Company shall pay all damages done  
to the fence or a boy described land during construction  
of above described power transmission line.  
Together with all the rights and privileges necessary or  
convenient for the full enjoyment or use thereof including  
the right of ingress and egress to and from said lines,  
and also the right to cut and keep clear all trees that  
may injure or endanger said lines.

To have and to hold the same to the said Company, its successors and assigns forever.
