

This Indenture made and entered into this the 10th day of October A.D. 1876, by and between J.N. Wright and his wife Dora Lurena Wright of Shelby Co. Ala, of the first part and R. Wood, of the County of Talladega and State of Alabama of the second part;

Witnesseth; That the said J.N. Wright and his wife Dora Lurena Wright for and in consideration of the sum of Five hundred forty Dollars to us in hand paid by the party of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have this day granted, bargained, sold, aliened, enfeoffed and conveyed and by these presents do grant, bargain sell enfeoff and convey to the said R. Wood, all that certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Shelby and State of Alabama, and more particularly described as follows to wit:

The north half of the northeast quarter (Lots C & D) of Section twenty three (23) township twenty (20) south, range two (2) east, containing eighty & $\frac{2}{100}$ (80.26) acres more or less.

To have and to hold the above described tract or parcel of land, together with the tenements and appurtenances thereto belonging or otherwise appertaining unto the said party of the second part his heirs and assigns forever. And the said J.N. Wright and his wife Dora Lurena Wright, of the first part for themselves their heirs, executors and administrators do warrant and will forever defend the title to the above described and hereby granted premises unto the said party of the second part his heirs and assigns from and against themselves, and all and every person claiming or holding under them the said party of the first part and against the lawful title claim or demand of all and every person whomsoever, claiming or holding by, from or under the Government of the United States.
