

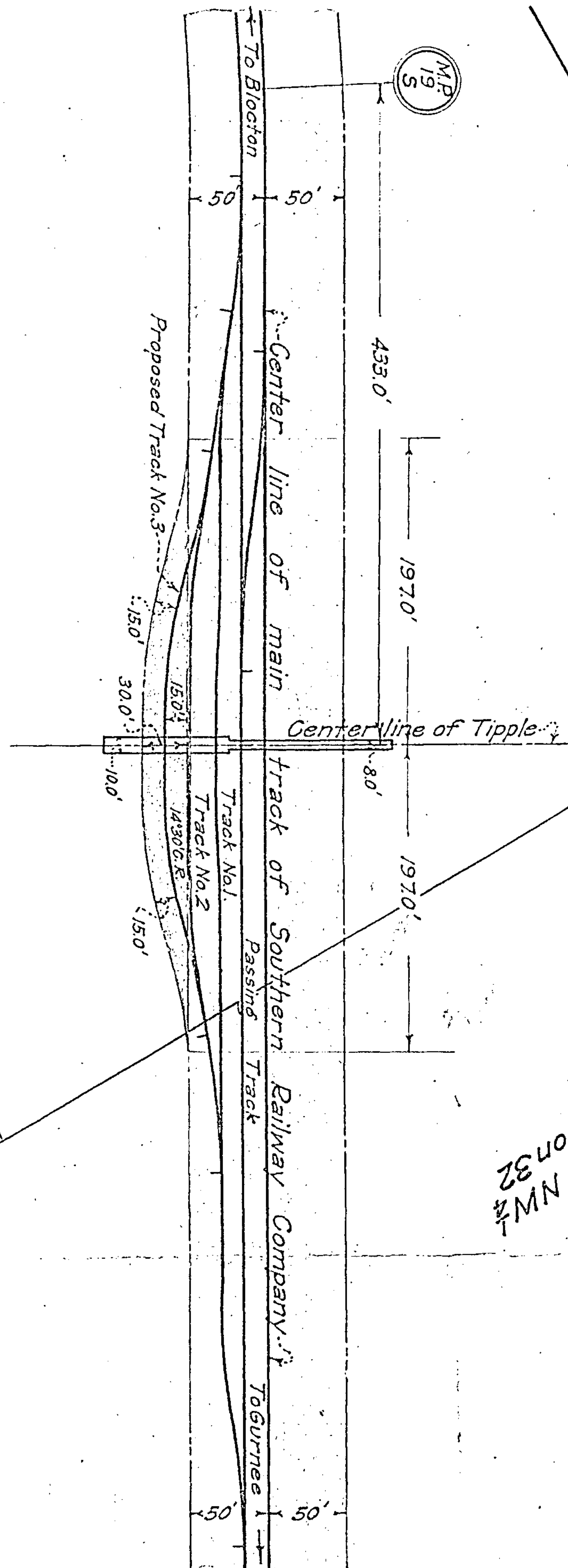

 of North-west-quarter of Section 32, Township 21 South
 of Range 4 west, Shelby County, Alabama, in location
 shown by map hereto attached and made a part of
 this instrument for the purpose of serving coal mine
 operations in the quarter-quarter section described, said
 right-of-way being bounded on the northwest by the
 southeast-right-of-way line of the Southern Railway
 Company's main track running between Guntersville Junc-
 tion, Alabama and Blocton, Alabama, for a distance of

three hundred and ninety-four (394) feet, more or less, bounded on the southeast by a line parallel with and fifteen (15) feet distant from the center line of dipple track no. 3, a distance of four hundred and one (401) feet, more or less, the distance of the last-described line from said right of way varying from zero to thirty feet;

To have and to hold, unto the said Southern Railway Company, its successors and assigns, upon the following conditions:

(1) That the title to the right-of-way herein conveyed shall revert to the grantor herein, its successors or assigns, when said dipple track is no longer required for serving aforesaid coal mine operations;

(2) That after the grantee herein, its successors or assigns, shall discontinue serving aforesaid coal mine operations and within sixty days after notice in writing from the grantor so to do, said grantee, its successors or assigns, shall without expense to the grantor herein, its successors or assigns, remove all rails and other material contained in said spur track from the land described;

(3) That the tracks and materials therefor, which the grantee may place upon the right-of-way hereby granted, shall not become a part of the realty, and may be removed by the grantee, its successors or assigns, whenever desired, and

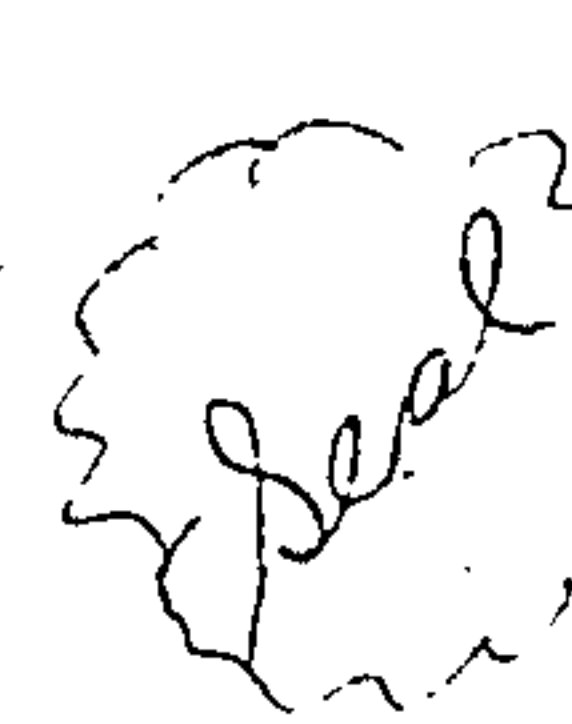
(4) That the grantor herein, its successors or assigns, shall have a right to police said right-of-way, upon condition, however, that there shall be no interference with the use of said dipple track by the grantee herein, its successors or assigns.

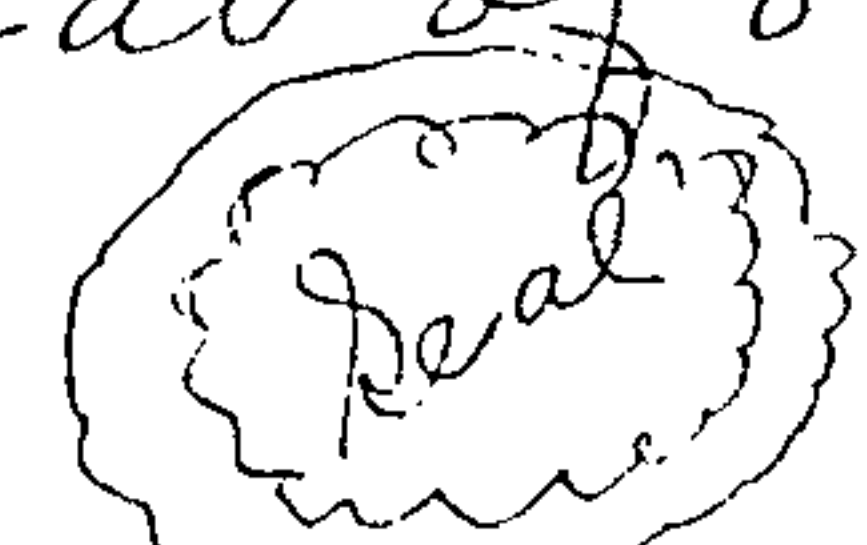
