

State of Alabama, to James Lolley and wife Eliza Lolley, for
 County of Shelby, and in consideration of the sum of Thirty
 and $\frac{00}{100}$ Dollars (\$30 00) to us in hand paid by Alabama Power
 Company, a Corporation, the receipt whereof is acknowledged,
 do hereby grant to said Company, its successors and as-
 signs the right to construct, operate and maintain electric
 transmission lines and all telegraph and telephone lines,
 boats, poles and appliances necessary or convenient in con-
 nection therewith upon a strip of land one hundred feet
 in width as the same is now located by the final loca-
 tion survey thereof heretofore made by said Company, over
 and across the lands of which it is hereinabove described
 as being a part, together with all the rights and privileges
 necessary or convenient for the full enjoyment or use
 thereof for the purpose above described, including the right
 of ingress and egress to and from said strip and the
 right to, cut and keep clear all trees and undergrowth
 and other obstructions on said strip and danger trees
 adjacent thereto when necessary.

Said strip is a part of a tract of land situated in Shelby
 County, Alabama, described as follows:

All that part of the N.E. 1/4 of S.W. 1/4 of Section 5 - which lies South
 of the tram road of the Montcallo Domestic Coal Company.

Also all that part of the S.W. 1/4 of S.W. 1/4 of said Section 5 - which
 lies East of McHenry Creek, all in Township 22 S Range 3 E.
 Said strip is substantially described as follows: Fifty feet on
 each side of a line and the continuation thereof beginning
 at a point on the East boundary of the N.E. 1/4 of S.W. 1/4 of said

Section of said point being 500 feet south of the North East
Corner thereof; thence running S. 13° 32' W. for a distance of 1135
feet to a point on the south boundary of said tract of land.
To have and to hold the same to the said Company, its suc-
cessors and assigns forever.
