To all to whom these Presents shall Come, Greeting:  
Whereas, Henry St. Stephens of Shelby County has deposited with the Secretary of the Board of Trustees of the University of Alabama a Certificate of the Agent of the Trustees of said Institution, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Henry St. Stephens or his representatives, according to the provisions of the Laws of the State "Regulating the sale of the University Lands," for the purchase of a lot at Wilson Hill in the town of Montevallo numbered Thirty Seven containing half an acre, according to the official plat of the Survey of the said Lands, furnished by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Henry St. Stephens.

Now Know Ye, That the Trustees of the University of Alabama in consideration of the Premises, and in conformity with the Ordinances of the Board of Trustees, passed in pursuance of the Acts of the General Assembly of the State of Alabama, in such cases made and provided, have given and granted and by these presents do give and grant unto the said Henry St. Stephens his assigns, and to his heirs the said tract above described, to have and to hold together with all the rights, privileges immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereto belonging unto the said Henry St. Stephens, heirs and assigns and to his assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof I, John Gayle, President of the Board of Trustees of the University of Alabama, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the Corporation to be hereunto affixed.
