

The State of Alabama, } At a meeting of the Trustees of the
Tuscaloosa County } University of Alabama on the 13th of
July 1859, it was ordained as follows:

"Whereas John S. Storms has forwarded to the Treasurer a bill of Exchange for \$661.34, the purchase money (including interest) of Lots numbered 20 & 21 in the town of Montevallo, Resolved that the Secretary execute deeds in the Name of the Trustees of the University to the said Storms to be delivered to him when said bill of Exchange is paid. Now Know Ye that for and in consideration of the premises as well as of the sum of Six hundred and sixty one $3\frac{1}{100}$ dollars paid to said University by said J. S. Storms, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the said University has, and by these presents doth bargain sell and convey unto the said John S. Storms his heirs and assigns forever Lots numbered 20 and 21 in the town of Montevallo Alabama sold by D. E. Statoens as agent of said University under a former ordinance of said board of Trustees - To have and to hold said Lots No. 20 & Lot No. 21 with the appurtenances thereunto belonging to the said John S. Storms his heirs and assigns hereby warranting the title to the same.

In testimony whereof by the Authority afore said, I have hereunto set my hand and affixed the Common Seal of said University this 9th day of July A.D. 1861.
