 the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do hereby grant
 to said Company, its successors and assigns, the right to
 construct, operate and maintain electric transmission
 lines and all telegraph and telephone lines, towers, poles and
 appliances necessary or convenient in connection therewith
 upon a strip of land one hundred feet in width, as the
 same is now located by the final location survey thereof
 heretofore made by said Company over and across the lands

of which it is hereinafter described as being a part, together with all the rights and privileges necessary or convenient for the full enjoyment or use thereof for the purposes above described, including the right of ingress and egress to and from said strip and the right to cut and keep clear all trees and undergrowth and other obstruction on said strip and danger trees adjacent thereto when necessary.

Said strip is a part of a tract situated in Shelby County Alabama, described as follows:

The south half of Southwest Quarter of Northwest Quarter of Section 8, and Northeast Quarter of Southeast Quarter of Section 7, all in Township 22 South, Range 3 West. Said strip is substantially described as follows: Beginning at a point on the South boundary of South half of Southwest Quarter of Northwest Quarter of said Section 8, said point being East 150 feet from the Southwest Corner of Southwest Quarter of Northwest Quarter and running thence North 13 degrees and 32 minutes East for a distance of 687 feet more or less to a point on the North boundary of South half of Southwest Quarter of Northwest Quarter of said Section 8; also beginning at a point on the South boundary of the Northeast Quarter of Southeast Quarter of Section 7, said point being West 150 feet from the Southeast Corner of the Northeast Quarter of Southeast Quarter of said Section 7 and running thence North 13 degrees and 32 minutes East for a distance of 660 feet more or less, to a point on the East boundary of Northeast Quarter of Southeast Quarter of said Section 7. Grantors reserve the right to cultivate said strip and use same in any manner that does not conflict with rights herein granted.

To have and to hold the same to the said Company, its successors and assigns forever. XX
