Randall who being by me first duly sworn, depose and on oath sayeth that he knows the lands in said county known as the Dinkins Place and the Satter Place, as it is now known, that he has known the same for a great many years namely 25 years, that there has not been in the past 25 years any person claiming to own said land by the name of Richardson, nor any of the personal representatives of any man or woman by that name; that there has not any claim set up against said land adverse to the present owners and those under whom they claim; that no person by the name of Morrow or any personal representative of any person by that name has been on said land claiming to own it in the past twenty five years or longer; and that no disturbance of title to any of said land has occurred or taken place adverse to the claim of said present owners, and those under whom they claim; that is to say: S.A.
