

No. 7. The State of Alabama.
Revenue Department.

Know all men by these Presents;

That Whereas on 11th day of June A.D. 1906 the Probate Court of Shelby County rendered a decree for the sale of lands hereinafter described and conveyed for the payment of State and County taxes then due from L. H. Marshall, the owner of said lands, and for the payment of the fees, costs and expenses of and under said decree, and the sale had in execution thereof.

And Whereas, thereafter to-wit, on the 16th day of July, 1906, under and in pursuance of said decree, said lands were regularly offered for sale by the Tax Collector of Shelby County for said taxes, fees, costs and expenses, and no person having bid a sufficient sum for said lands to pay the same, said lands to pay the same, said lands were bid in for the State for the sum of said taxes, fees, costs and expenses.

And Whereas, the time allowed by law for the redemption of said lands has elapsed since said sale, and the same not having been redeemed, the title thereto under said sale is still in the State.

And Whereas, said lands have been entered upon the books of this Department, and the Auditor and Treasurer of this State, with the approval of the Governor, have fixed the price of said land, and ascertained that the sum of six $\frac{20}{100}$ Dollars is sufficient to cover and satisfy all claims of the State and County against said land for or on account of taxes, interest, fees and costs and officers'

fees which were due upon or have accrued against said lands, as provided for in Chapter 45, Article 13, of The Code of Alabama of 1907.

And Whereas, application has been made to the Auditor of the State by International Securities Corporation to purchase said lands, and said sum of - - - dollars therefor has been paid into the State Treasury.

Now Therefore, I, M. C. Allgood, as Auditor of the State of Alabama by virtue of and in accordance with the provisions of said Chapter 45, Article 13, of The Code of Alabama of 1907, with the approval of the Governor of Alabama, and in consideration of the premises above set out, have this day granted, bargained, sold and conveyed, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said International Securities Corporation without warranty or covenant of any kind on the part of the State express or implied, all right and title of the State of Alabama, in and to said lands, described as follows:

One house and lot No. 15, in Hillman, Ala. lying and being situate in said County and State to have and to hold the same, the said right and title of the State in the lands above said unto International Securities Corporation and their heirs and assigns forever.
