

State of Alabama } My Name is Alf. Prasher, I am 57 years
 County of Shelby, } old, and am a resident of Shelby County
 Alabama, living about 3 miles out from Vaudin and
 live on my farm of 200 acres, a portion of which I have
 owned for 36 or 37 years. I was born within about 4
 miles of where I now reside and have known the S.E.¹/₄
 of the N.E.¹/₄ of Sec. 12 Township 18, Range 1 East, known as
 the "Britt" place for over 40 years and never knew or
 heard of any one claiming to own the above mentioned
 40 acres of land except Mr. J. K. Dwyck and from whom I
 purchased the E.¹/₂ of the N.E.¹/₄ of Sec. 12, Tp. 18, R. 1 East, con-
 sisting of 80 acres and comprising and including the
 Britt 40 mentioned above on March 2nd 1891 paying
 therefor the sum of 290⁰⁰¢. When I purchased the E.¹/₂ of
 the N.E.¹/₄ of Sec. 12 Tp. 18, R. 1 East on March 2nd 1891
 no one was in actual physical possession of said
 property, and there had been no improvements made
 on said 80 acres which included the land after-
 wards sold W. H. Britt. I cleared up the Britt place
 put it in cultivation and had a house built thereon
 in a year or two after I bought it. I have had
 actual, open, hostile, notorious and continuous posses-
 sion of the S.E.¹/₄ of the N.E.¹/₄ of Section 12 Township
 18 Range 1 East until I sold said 40 acres to W. H.
 Britt on Sept 26th 1905, and said W. H. Britt from
 the time he purchased said 40 acres from me up to the
 time he sold said land to the Ingram Realty Co. on

March 31st-1914, was in peaceable possession of said 40 acres, that he built a house and further improved said land and no one has ever disputed either the possession of myself or of Mr Britt or any of our successors in title.

I did not know Jm C. Rhodes who is said to have entered the above described 40 acres of land on the 10th of October 1890. I never knew that any man by the name of Newman ever owned or claimed to own the "Britt" 40 acres of land, although I bought 40 acres of land in Section 1 from a man named Newman, he never spoke to me about or claimed to own any interest in the Britt 40 acres. I was born near here in 1860, within 4 miles of the W. H. Britt place and never heard of any one claiming to own the Britt 40 acres except Duyck and he sold it to me and I know positively that no one ever had possession of said place prior to my buying it from Duyck, and me and my successors in title have been in possession of the said S.E. 1/4 of N.E. 1/4 of Sec. 12 Tp. 18, Range 1 East peacefully, openly, notoriously and continuously since I bought it from Duyck on the 2nd day of March 1891. The Britt 40 acres of land lying along by and bordering my land on the South and I am well acquainted with it.
