 part for and in consideration of three hundred dollars
 to him paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged,
 have bargained, sold and conveyed and by these presents
 do bargain, sell and convey unto James Butler of the
 second part his entire interest in the following lands,
 to-wit: The $N\frac{1}{2}$ of $N.E\frac{1}{4}$ and $E\frac{1}{2}$ of $N\frac{1}{2}$ and $N\frac{1}{2}$ of
 of $N\frac{1}{2}$ of Sec. 24 Township 21 of Range No. 3 containing
 two hundred acres more or less together with all
 the appurtenances, hereditaments pertaining thereto, also
 all the right, title, interest, claims and demands both in
 law and equity which the said Thomas West has had in
 the said land to the party of the second part.

To have and to hold for himself, his heirs and assigns
 forever the claim that the party of the first part held in
 said land was one entire half and hereafter the entire
 land belonging to the aforesaid party of the second
 part.
