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

Whereas Benjamin Rupert assignee of Benjamin Clements of Fayetteville 2 - has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Tuscaloosa in Alabama, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Benjamin Clements, according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provisions for the sale of the Public Lands" for the East half of the North East Quarter of Section Twenty two, of Township Twenty two of Range Three West in the District

of Tuscaloosa and State of Alabama, containing eighty acres and seven hundredths of an acre, according to the official plat of the Survey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Benjamin Clements.

Now know ye that the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and, by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Benjamin Clements the said tract above described; To Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereto belonging, unto the said Benjamin Clements and his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof I James Monroe President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand, at the City of Washington, the second day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty three, and of the Independence of the United States the forty seventh.
