 Shelby County, } T. H. Davis, before me C. H. Florey, a
 Justice Peace in and for said County, in said State,
 personally appeared T. H. Davis, who is personally known
 to me and who being by me first duly sworn deposes
 and says on oath that he is 58 years of age, is now and
 has been for 40 years past in the business of farming and
 carrying mail, at or near the post office of Warpersville,
 Shelby County Alabama; that he lives about 1 mile from and
 has personally known for 40 years next preceding the
 date hereof the following described land in said County
 and State, to-wit: A part of the S. E $\frac{1}{4}$ of the S. E $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec-
 tion 28, and of the S. W $\frac{1}{4}$ of S. W $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 27 in Tp. 19,
 Range 2 East described as follows: Beginning at a point
 in the said S. E $\frac{1}{4}$ of S. E $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 28, at the forks of the
 Klaget ferry and Kymulga ferry roads on the North side
 of said Kymulga ferry road, thence running in a
 southeasterly direction along the North side of said
 Kymulga ferry road to the South line of said S. E $\frac{1}{4}$ of
 S. E $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 28, thence East along said South line and
 the South line of Section 27 to the Southeast Corner of the
 S. W $\frac{1}{4}$ of S. W $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 27, thence North along the East
 line of said described forty acres about 700 feet to the
 said Klaget ferry road, thence in a Southwesterly direction
 along the South side of said road to the place of begin-
 ning, excepting one acre in the N. E Corner of said tract
 of land owned by the Colored Baptist Church, also a strip
 of land lying on the South side of the S. $\frac{1}{2}$ of S. E $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec-
 tion 28, and being all that part of said half Quarter Section
 that lies South of said Kymulga ferry road and East of
 the brick store lot owned by J. H. Hilborn. All the above de-
 scribed in Township 19, Range 2 East and being in all
 50 acres more or less.

That about the year 1880 said lands were in the actual

adverse possession of R. L. Flippin under a claim of ownership and remained in his possession under claim of ownership until about the year 1888 when he sold the same to R. M. Borum, who took possession thereof and remained in such possession under claim of ownership until the year 1898, when he sold the same to L. B. Borum, who took possession thereof and remained in such possession under claim of ownership until the year 1906, when he sold the same to William Looney and his wife, a better description of said land being included in an additional deed from L. B. Borum and husband R. L. Borum to Mrs Looney dated December 10th 1911, the said Mrs Looney and wife M. J. Looney remained in such possession of said lands until the 27th day of July, 1908, when he sold the same to Mrs L. C. Borum, who remained in such possession of said lands until the 25th day of August, 1911, when he sold the same to F. B. Borum, who remained in such possession of said lands until the 21st day of December, 1912, when he sold the same to Olga Ray who remained in such possession of said lands until the 5th day of March, 1914, that said lands were acquired by said applicant Harry Phillips Kimbrough from Olga Ray, and said applicant, Harry Phillips Kimbrough went into possession thereof on or about the 5th day of March, 1914, since which date and up to and including the time of the execution of this affidavit said Harry Phillips Kimbrough has been continuously in the open, visible, notorious, hostile, exclusive, peaceful, adverse possession of all of said lands, paying taxes thereon and claiming to own the same; that said Harry Phillips Kimbrough and those whom he holds said lands to the personal knowledge of affiant have consecutively successfully and uninterruptedly held open, visible, notorious, hostile, exclusive, peaceful and continuous adverse possession of all of said lands paying taxes thereon and claiming to own the same for more than 35-years just past and that affiant does not know nor has he heard of any claim to any part of said lands adverse to, or casting any doubt whatever upon the absolute

ownership thereof by said Harry Phillips Kimbrough.
 That the possession of each one of the above named owners
 was evidenced by the exercise of the following acts of
 ownership and possession, to-wit: they fenced, cultivated,
 lived upon, paid taxes and exercised all visible means
 of possession and claims of ownership. Affiant further
 states that Lula Borum is one and the same person as
 L. C. Borum and Lula C. Borum.
