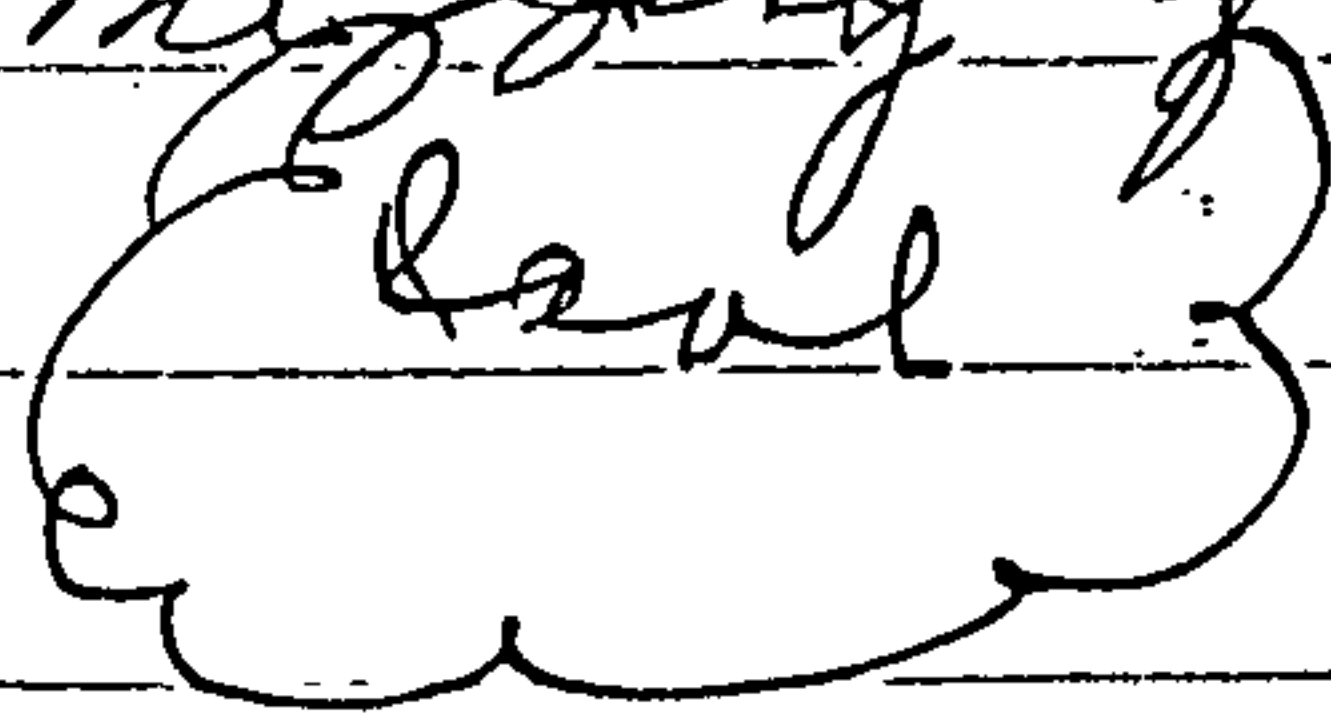

 80 acres, issued in favor of Barret Lewis Private in Captain
 Walker's Company - First Regiment North Carolina Militia, Nov
 of 1812, has been returned to the General Land Office, with
 evidence that the same has been duly located upon the
 East half of the South East Quarter of Section Three, in Town-
 ship Twenty four of Range Twelve East in the District of
 Lands subject to sale at Tuscaloosa Alabama, containing
 fifty two acres and seventy hundredths of an acre, ac-
 cording to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said lands
 returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor
 General: Which has been assigned unto George F. Wash-
 ington. Now know ye, that there is therefore granted by the
 United States unto the said George F. Washington the
 tract of Land above described: To Have and to Hold

 unto the said George F. Washington and to his heirs
 and assigns forever.
