 Shelby County. } Place in and for said County,
 personally appeared Isaac Powell and H. M. Kelly, who
 being duly sworn depose and says that they are well ac-
 quainted with the following described land to-wit: The $N\frac{1}{2}$
 of S $N\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 6. Tp. 22. R. 3 N, and $N\frac{1}{4}$ of $N\frac{1}{4}$ of said
 Sec. 6, and $E\frac{1}{2}$ of $N\frac{1}{4}$ and $N\frac{1}{4}$ of S. $E\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 1 Tp. 22. R.
 4 N, and $S\frac{1}{2}$ of S. $E\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 36. Tp. 21 R. 4 N, and has been
 since the year 1868 living in the immediate neighbor-
 hood and at times upon a portion of said land, to-wit:
 the $N\frac{1}{2}$ of S. $N\frac{1}{4}$ of said Sec. 6 Tp. 22 R. 3 N, which Isaac
 Powell has gained for from Thos. Harrison who put af-
 fiant Powell in possession of the same in the year 1878,
 that the said Thos. Harrison had purchased said land at
 tax sale in the year 1870 or 1871, and had been in pos-
 session of the same up to the time he put affiant Powell
 in possession, that affiant Powell held the same, claim-
 ing it as his own under his said purchase, openly, no-
 tionably and adversely, cultivating it and using it for
 the purposes for which it was adapted and occupying it
 as a homestead until the year 1881, when he turned the
 same over to Solomon Evans, that the said Solomon Evans
 continued to occupy the same in connection with
 other adjoining land as a homestead, openly, notio-
 nably, adversely and continuously up to the time he sold the
 same to Lucas J. Cary, that said Solomon Evans claimed
 the said last mentioned land under purchase from said
 Thos. Harrison, affiant Powell having rescinded his bargain
 for said purchase, and the said adjoining land, to-wit:
 the $N\frac{1}{4}$ of S. $E\frac{1}{4}$ and S. $E\frac{1}{4}$ of $N\frac{1}{4}$, Sec. 1 Tp. 22, R. 4 N. the

said Solomon Evans claimed by purchase from one E. F. Wallis; that the said Lucy J. Cory had been in the open, adverse and continuous possession of the said land by her tenants since her purchase from said Evans in 1897; that the S $\frac{1}{2}$ of S. E $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 36, Tp. 21 Range 4 West, and the N. E $\frac{1}{4}$ of N. E $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 1, Tp. 22 R. 4 West and the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 6, Tp. 22 Range 3 West all in Shelby County, State of Alabama, has been used and occupied for the purposes for which said lands were adapted, openly, adversely, notoriously and continuously from the year 1858 to the year 1898 by Bud Hays, H. M. Hyde, Joe Lally, Andrew Forley, Thos. Fulgham, H. M. Walker, Robert Nolan and the Fulgham heirs, and Saml L. Walker and H. E. Brinkerhoff, J. B. Randall and L. J. Cary by color of title and continuous, open, notorious, adverse possession.
