

Anniston, Ala., January 29, 1918

Whereas O. M. Alexander has endorsed said bonds as security for funds loaned or advanced by The City Bank and Trust Company to O. M. Alexander as trustee for Childers & Paschall with which to pay for work for Camp McClellan, Ala. and for other purposes connected with the contract entered into relative thereto by said Alexander, E. F. Childers and F. A. Paschall of date Dec. 5th 1917 and as security for funds that may from time to time hereafter be so loaned or advanced such notes to be signed by said E. F. Childers and further in consideration of the terms of said contract and for the faithful performance of the terms of said contract, Now therefore in consideration of the premises and for other valuable consideration, we the undersigned do hereby convey and pass title to said O. M. Alexander to all work and other property now handled & to be handled dealt in and bought, under said contract it being the true intent under said contract that until the terms of said contract are faithfully carried out, said work paid for and the proceeds properly distributed, all of said work and other property handled now and hereafter under said contract shall be in the name of said Alexander and the title to same shall be in him and the title to all money in payment for same whether the check be made payable to said Alexander or to either one of the undersigned shall be in said Alexander who shall thereby be secured for any liability he may be to in any manner whether to said bank or otherwise. In other words said Alexander is to receive all money for said work and other property and he shall disburse the same, acting as a trustee for all the parties concerned including the shipper or seller of said work and other property handled from time to time under said contract.
