 duly acknowledged, does hereby reconse, release, quit-
 claim and convey unto the said Alabama Turpentine
 Company, the following described real property, situated
 in Shelby County, State of Alabama, to-wit:
 The Northeast Quarter of Southwest Quarter of Section

31, Township 18, Range 1 West. My undivided two-fifths interest in the South half of the Northwest Quarter, North east Quarter of North West Quarter and South West Quarter of Northeast Quarter, Section 6, Township 19, Range 1 West. The timber and trees ten (10) inches in diameter at a height of fifteen (15) inches from surface of ground, except the timber and trees on the South side of dwelling house in Southwest Quarter of Northeast Quarter, in South half of North West Quarter, North East Quarter of Northwest Quarter, and the Southwest Quarter of North East Quarter, Section 6, Township 19, Range 1 West, and the trees on the West half of North West Quarter of Southeast Quarter, Section 6, Township 19, Range 1 West.

All timber and trees on the Southwest Quarter of Southwest Quarter, Section 29, and the South East Quarter of South East Quarter and the North half of South east Quarter, Section 30, all in Township 18, Range 1 East. Also all timber and trees, except the hard wood on that portion of the Northeast Quarter of Northeast Quarter of Section 31, Township 18, Range 1 East, described as follows: - An all that part of said 40 acre tract lying North of the Mantuallo Public Road, being 11 acres more or less, and also all that part of said 40 acre tract described as follows: Beginning on section line in center of Mantuallo Road, thence South 41 degrees West along said road 145 yards; thence South 18 degrees East 84 yards, to a point, thence South 30 degrees East 292 yards to the section line, thence North 440 yards to point of beginning, containing 11.19 acres more or less.

To gother with all rights, privileges, easements and hereafterments to or for or pertaining to said lands, timber and timber rights, heretofore conveyed by said Alabama Turpentine Company to the said Kelly & Sons Lumber Company by deed dated February 26, 1918; it being the intention of this conveyance to reconvey to said Alabama Turpentine Company all of the right, title and interest in and to the above described lands, timber and timber

rights and privileges therein, or thereunto pertaining, conveyed by the said Alabama Turpentine Company to the said Bally & Sons Lumber Company, as to-wit: the 6th day of February 1918.

To Have and to Hold unto the said Alabama Turpentine Company, its successors and assigns forever.
