To all to whom these presents shall come, greeting:

No. 24135 Whereas Marion W. Jones, of Shelby County, Alabama has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Montgomery, Alabama whereby it appears that a full payment has been made by the said Marion W. Jones according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 2d day April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," and the acts supplemental thereto, for the fourth west quarter of section twenty six in Township Twenty one East of Range two West of Huntsville Meridian in Alabama, containing one hundred and fifty nine acres and forty seven hundredths of an acre according to the Office Plan of the Survey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Marion W. Jones.

I do know ye, that the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Marion W. Jones and to his heirs, the said tract above described;

To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, therunto belonging, unto the said Marion W. Jones and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, Benjamin Harrison, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
