of December, 1917, a certificate of which said
judgment is recorded in Judgment Record "B"

(2) A judgement in the sum of \$63.98, besides \$33.30 costs, recovered by said First National Bank of Birmingham, Alabama, against said George R. Moore and others in the Circuit Court of Chilton County, Alabama, on the 3d day of December, 1917. A certificate of notice said judgement is recorded "B", page 64, in the office of the Probate Judge of Shelby County, Alabama; and

(3) A judgement in the sum of \$1040.00 besides \$8.40 costs, recovered by said First National Bank of Birmingham, Alabama, against said George R. Moore and P. O. West, in the County Court of Shelby County, Alabama, on the 13th day of March, 1916. A certificate of which said judgement is recorded in Judgement Record "B", page 15, in the office of Judge of Probate of Shelby County, Alabama.

Harrelly, of Columbiana Alabama, its secretary
in fact, for it and in its name to
endorse on the record of each of said
certificates of said three judgments in
the office of the Probate Judge of Shelby
County, Alabama, an assignment and transfer
thereof to the said John B. Moore without
recourse on the undersigned.
