these presents:

That for the consideration of the sum of
five dollars received to my free satisfac-
tion of Lee Wilson Andrew Moore and
Henry Evans I, Lucius A Barbour do here-
by release transfer and quitclaim unto
the said Lee Wilson Andrew Moore and
Henry Evans the following described tract
of land situated in Shelby County, Alabama
and bounded and described as follows to-
with wit: the lot of land on which the
two story church building now stands
with the building and appurtenances there-
unto belonging and fronting northward
on Mechanic's Street, said lot is described
as follows: from a point of the Hunts-
ville Meridian about one hundred and
thirty-six feet north of the southeast corner
of section 12 of Township 22 South of Range
one west of Huntsville Meridian run north
eighty-eight degrees forty-five minutes
west about one hundred and sixty-
feet to a place of beginning thence north
three degrees and thirty minutes west
parallel to the Huntsville Meridian about
two hundred and twenty-five feet to a
point on the south side of the street running
parallel to the new railroad line on the
south side, and distant one hundred and
twenty-five feet from center of said
Railroad line measured at right angles
thereto, thence by a curved line of two
thousand and thirty-five feet radius south-
westly parallel to said Railroad and
one hundred and twenty-five feet therefrom
about one hundred and twenty feet thence
South one degree and fifteen minutes west
one hundred and seventy-four feet, thence

South eighty eight degrees and forty five minutes East one hundred and twenty five feet to a place of beginning, said tract containing (five hundred and thirty four one thousandths acres more or less), a plat of which is appended to a deed made by Shelby Iron Company to grantor, and others which deed is dated January 28th 1890, and recorded in volume 13 on page 282 of the Deed Record of Shelby County, Alabama To have and to hold unto the said Lee Wilson, Andrew Moore and Henry Evans their assigns, survivors and successors in trust forever, in trust however for the following persons and purposes that is to say that the said lots and buildings and appurtenances shall be used and controlled as a place of religious worship of the Congregational order to those holding the tenets and creeds of the Orthodox Congregational Churches of this Country as declared from time to time by the National Congregational Council.

And the desire and request of the members worshipping in in said church the property held for them or any part thereof, may be sold for reinvestment in other real estate to be held and used as the same trust as the property sold and if the said trustees deem it desirable to do so, they may at their own motion sell said properties or any part thereof and reinvest the proceeds in other real estate to be held as the same trust as that sold.

Any of the trustees herein named may resign the trust and the remaining trustees may elect a successor to the trustee so resigning and the trustee so elected shall have all the powers

of the original trustee named herein, and
the surviving trustee shall have full power
to fill any and all vacancies which
may occur by reason of the death or
removal from the State or by the mental
incapacity of any of the trustees herein
provided for.
