Storrs for and in consideration of the sum of Twenty Five Dollars (\$25.00) to us in hand paid by Alabama Power Company, a corporation the receipt whereof is acknowledged, do grant, to regide company, its successors and assigns, the right to construct, operate and maintain electric transmission lines and all telegraph and telephone lines, towers, poles and appliances necessary or convenient in connection therewith from time to time upon a strip of land one hundred feet in width, as said strip is now located by the final location survey thereof heretofore made by said company, over and across the lands of which it is hereinafter described as being a part, together with all the rights and privileges necessary or convenient for the full enjoyment or use thereof for the purposes above described, including the right of ingress and egress to and from said strip and the right to cut and keep clear all trees and undergrowth and other obstruction on said strip, and danger trees adjacent thereto where necessary except the shade trees immediately adjoins old residence on said property. Said strip is a part of a tract of land situated in Shelby County, Alabama, described as follows:

The southeast quarter of the southwest quarter of Section 9, Township 22 south, range 1 east. Said strip is substantially described as follows: Fifty feet on each side of a line and the continuations thereof; beginning at a point on the south boundary of said section 9, said point being east 2279.4 feet from the southwest corner of said section 9, thence running north 5 degrees 18 minutes west for a distance of 1376.9 feet more or less, to a point on the north boundary of said southeast quarter of the southwest quarter of said section 9. This transfer having been assented to on September 6, 1922 by Willie and Harris Bradford, who hold bond for title to this property.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same to the said company, its successors and assigns forever. The grantors shall have the right to cultivate and use said strip of land for any purpose not inconsistent with the rights which the grantee may from time to time exercise hereunder.


