Before me, the undersigned authority in and for said county in said state, personally appeared H. L. Badham, who by me first duly sworn, deposes and says on oath as follows; that he was personally acquainted with Andrew M. Adger, on June 29th 1896, and that he knows of his own knowledge that at said time, and at the time of his execution of the deed of conveyance from David Roberts and Andrew M. Adger to the Saginaw Lumber Company (said deed of conveyance bearing date of the 29th day of June, 1896, and being filed for record on the 18th day of July, 1896, and being recorded in Deed Book Nineteen (19) at page 184, records in the office of the Probate Judge of Jefferson County, Alabama,) that the said Andrew M. Adger was a widower, or unmarried man, and, affiant says further, that he was acquainted at that time with the property as described in the said above described deed from Andrew M. Adger and David Roberts to the Saginaw Lumber Company, said property being described as follows; the north $\frac{1}{2}$ of northeast $\frac{1}{4}$, the northeast $\frac{1}{4}$ of southeast $\frac{1}{4}$, the south $\frac{1}{2}$ of southeast $\frac{1}{4}$, and the west $\frac{1}{2}$ of Section twenty seven (27), township twenty (20), south, range one (1) west, and situated in Shelby County, Alabama, and that said above described property was not at that time, the homestead of either the said Andrew M. Adger or David Roberts, the conveyors in said deed of conveyance.
