AGREEMENT

We, the undersigned, Arthur C. DeShazo, son of Joseph R. DeShazo, deceased, Vernon DeShazo son of L. G. DeShazo and grandson of Joseph R. DeShazo deceased, Ethel DeShazo daughter of L. G. DeShazo and granddaughter of Joseph R. DeShazo deceased, and Mrs. Addie DeShazo, widow of Joseph R. DeShazo deceased, being all of the heirs and next kin of the said Joseph R. DeShazo, deceased, do hereby agree that the estate, consisting of both personal and real property of the said Joseph R. DeShazo, deceased who died on to-wit: the 10th day of April, 1924, in Shelby County, Alabama, be divided as follows:

The said Arthur C. DeShazo to get one third of said estate, Vernon and Ethel DeShazo being brother and sister jointly to get one third of said estate and Mrs. Addie DeShazo, to get one third and it is further agreed by the undersigned that all of the heirs herein named shall convey any and all real estate of which the said Joseph R. DeShazo died deceased to Arthur C. DeShazo as administrator of the estate of Joseph R. DeShazo and as trustee, with full authority for the said Arthur C. DeShazo to sell and convey the said real estate to whomsoever he may get to buy same at and for any sum that he may see fit and deem best and said proceeds shall be placed in the hands of the administrator and to be divided as per the agreement herein stipulated. It being specifically understood that any rent accruing to the said Arthur C. DeShazo as such a dministrator & as trustee pending getting a sale for said real estate, shall accrue to benefit of this estate.

And we do particularly agree and hereby authorize the said Arthur C. DeShazo to pay all debts and unpaid claims left by the said Joseph R. DeShazo deceased and particularly do we instruct him to pay funeral expenses and to reimburse George DeShazo for further expense on drug bills to the extent of \$34.50 and each of us, for ourselves hereby waive any and all right to any further interest in any real estate which we may have and be entitled to by virtue of being a heir of the said Joseph R. DeShazo and the said Mrs. Addie DeShazo does hereby specifically and particularly waive any right to any dower interest she may have in said real estate of which the said Joseph R. DeShazo died seized. And she does hereby further relinquish and waive any right to any further interest in said estate to which she may be entitled and the said Mrs. Addie DeShazo waives any claim she may have to homestead exemptions rights or other rights and does waive her right to claim as exempt any personal property to which she may be entitled as widow of the said Joseph R. DeShazo deceased.
