Ingram, who is known to me, and who being by me first duly sworn, deposes and says on oath, that he is a son of D. L. Ingram, deceased, who is grantee in the deed of Mrs. Emma Hagans and her husband J. A. Hagan, deeded October the 21st. 1913, and recorded in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama, in deed Book 53, at page 244, which said land is described therein as follows:

The lands owned by Mrs. Emma Hagans and her husband in Section 7, Township 20, Range 2 east, the amount of land bounded as follows: on the north by the ½ section line of section 7, on the east by Yellow Leaf Creek, on the south by Section 18, and on the west by the 80 acres of land owned by the Alabama Mineral Land Company, in Section 7, containing 50 acres more or less.

Further deposing, affiant says that he is the T. M. Ingram, who is grantee in the deed of said D. L.
