KNOW YE, that Mrs. Pearl V. Cost of the County of Shelby having made proof that She has been in adverse possession either personally or with his predecessors in possession, under color of title, for more than twenty years prior to May 1st. 1908, of the north half and the southwest quarter of the northeast quarter and the west half and the southeast quarter of the southeast quarter of Section Number sixteen, in Township number 19, of range number 2 W in said county of Shelby and containing 240.30 acres, more or less; which proof is certified by the Attorney General to be satisfactory.

And the State Superintendent of Education and the State Auditor having certified that neither the State nor any department thereof holds any note, bond, obligation or other contract of any one for the purchase money of such land, all of which is done and authorized under the provisions of an Act entitled "An Act to further regulate the issuance of patents to owners or purchasers of sixteenth section land and prescribe the conditions on which the said patents may be issued and by whom", approved September 25, 1915.

NOW, THEREFORE, the State of Alabama Grants the Tract of Land above described, with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging, unto the said Mrs. Pearl V. Cost and to her heirs and assigns forever.
