Whereas, Thomas T. Walker of Bibb County has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Tuskaloosa in Alabama whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Thomas T. Walker according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands", for the east half of the northwest quarter of Section Seven, in Township twenty two, of range one west in the District of Tuskaloosa and State of Alabama, containing eighty one acres and fifty eight hundredths of an acre, according to the official plat of the Survey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Thomas T. Walker.

NOW KNOW YE, that the United States of America in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Thomas T. Walker and his heirs the said tract above described:

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, there to belonging unto the said Thomas T. Walker and to his heirs and assigns forever.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF I, James Monroe President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
