NOW KNOW YE, that the United States of America in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided; HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED and by these presents do give and grant unto the said William Littlefield and to his heirs, the said tract above described: To have and to hold immunities the same together with all the rights, privileges/and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging unto the said William Littlefield and to his heirs and assigns forever.
