TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME GREETING:

Whereas there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Montgomery, Alakama where it appears that pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May 1862, "To secure Homesteads to actual settlers on the Public Domain" and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of John C.Davis has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the south half of the southeast quarter and the east half of the southwest quarter of Section two in Township twenty one south of range two west of Huntsville Meridian in Alabama, containing one hundred and sixty acres and twelve hundredths of an acre, according to the official plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Survey or General:

NOW KNOW YE, that there is therefore, granted by the United States, unto the said John C. Davis the tract of land above described: To have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said John C. Davis and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I Grover Cleveland President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
