

## AFFIDAVIT

Before me, the undersigned authority in and for said County, in said State, personally appeared W. W. Wallace who is known to me and who being by me first duly sworn, deposes and says on oath that he knew W. H. Cameron, to whom T. A. Morris conveyed the southeast quarter of southeast quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of Section 29, and the northeast quarter of northeast quarter (NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of NE $\frac{1}{4}$ ) and the east half of northwest quarter (E $\frac{1}{2}$  of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of northeast quarter (NE $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of Section 32, Township 21, Range 1 west, as shown by deed recorded in Deed Book 23, page 530 on December 27th 1921.

Affiant further says that the said W. H. Cameron was the son of J. A. Cameron and S. F. Cameron and that sometimes prior to 1910, W. H. Cameron died leaving no child or children or widow surviving him and leaving as his sole heirs his father and mother and so far as your affiant knows left no will.

Affiant further says that he is familiar with the entire tract of land purchased by Walter Hoffman which was conveyed to the son of Walter Hoffman, namely, H. W. Hoffman, as shown by deed recorded in Deed Book 73, page 92 with the exception that the deed should have read the northwest quarter of southwest quarter of Section 28. Affiant further says that said property has been in the continuous adverse possession of H. W. Hoffman or those under whom he claims for over twenty years and so far as your affiant knows or has been informed that no one other than H. W. Hoffman or those under whom he claims have ever asserted any right, title or interest in said property.
