Before me Alice Donahoe, a Notary Public in and for said County and said State, personally appeared C_{r} awford Johnson who is known to me, and who being by me duly sworn did depose and say:

That he is the identical party named as Grantor in that certain deed from the deponent Crawford Johnson and wife, Caroline A. Johnson, Crawford Johnson Jr., and wife Mary Stuart S. Johnson, Allen A. Johnson, R.C. Jones, Eillian S. Eowlkes, the deponent as Trustee, and the deponent and R. C. Jones as surviving Directors and Trustees in Dissolution of the Birmingham Coca-Cola Bottling Company, a dissolved corporation, to Crawford Johnson & Co. Inc. a Delaware corporation, dated the 17th day of July, 1926;

That he was President of said Birmingham Coca-Cola Bottling Company at the time of its dissolution on, to-wit: April 15, 1919, and that at the time of its dissolution the sole stockholders thereof were deponent, Caroline A. Johnson, Crawford Johnson Jr., Allen Johnson, R. C.Jones and F. B. Fowlkes;

That said Allen Johnson who joined in the foresaid dissolution proceedings and said Allen A. Johnson who joined in the aforesaid deed are one and the same person, and was unmarried on the said 17th day of July, 1926 and remained unmarried until the date of this affidavit;

That said F. B. Fowlkes who joined in the said dissolution proceedings and Frank B. Fowlkes who was referred to in the aforesaid deed are one and the same person and that he died between April 15, 1919, and July 17, 1926; that Lillian S. Fowlkes was his widow, and was unmarried on the 17th day of July, 1926 and has remained unmarried from that time until the date of this affidavit;

That said R. C. Jones was an unmarried man on said 17th day of July, 1926, and has remained unmarried until the date of this affidavit;

That said Caroline A. Johnson was on the 17th day of July, 1926 the wife of deponent and has been and is now the wife of deponent; and that said Mary Stuart S. Johnson was on said 17th day of July, 1926, and has been since and is now the wife of said Crawford Johnson Jr.,

That following the dissolution of said Birmingham Coca-Cola Bottling Company a partnership composed of the stockholders thereof at the time of dissolution and no other person did acquire the legal title and possession of all the personal property thereof, and the equitable title to all of the real property; and that thereafter deponent did acquire all of the interest of said Frank B. Fowlkes in said partnership and the assets, real and personal, thereof;

That thereafter a partnership doing tusiness under the name of Crawford Johnson & Co. and composed of deponent, Caroline A. Johnson, Crawford Johnson Jr., Mary Stuart S. Johnson, Allen A. Johnson and R. C. Jones was organized and acquired legal title and possession of all of the personal property of said Birmingham Coca-Cola Bottling Company and the equitable title to all of its real property; that no other person was even a member of said partnership and that said persons were the only members of said partnership from the time of its organization to the date of this affidavit;

That deponent is the identical party named as Trustee in that certain deed from Estes Home Company, Inc., dated October 23, 1925, and recorded in the office of the Probate Judge of Jefferson County, Alabama, in Volume 1421 of Deeds at page 315, conveying

to Crawford Johnson, Trustee, the following described property, to-wit:

Part of Block numbered Six Hundred and Forty Five (645) according to the Elyton Land Company's survey of the City of Birmingham, Alabama, fronting two hundred and forty (240) feet on the eastern side of thirty third street and extending in an easterly direction of that uniform width one hundred and ninety (190) feet along the northerly line of Eleventh Avenue to the westerly line of a twenty (20) foot alley running north and south through said Block, less a twenty six (26) foot right of way of the Birmingham Belt Railroad, situated in Jefferson County, Alabama.

That in taking title to the property aforesaid deponent acted as Trustee for the members of the partnership of Crawford Johnson & Co. aforesaid, and that the purchase price of said property was paid out of the partnership funds:

That deponent is the identical party named as Grantee in that certain deed from deponent and R. C.Jones as Directors of said Birmingham Coca-Cola Bottling Company, a corporation, heretofore dissolved, dated the 15th day of January 1923, and conveying Lots One (1), Two (2), Three (3) and Four (4) in Block 172 according to the present plan and survey of the City of Birmingham, Jefferson County, Alabama, and Lot "D" in Block 484 of the West Lake Highlands, Survey, located in Jefferson County, Alabama, and that the consideration for the said conveyance was paid by the members of the partnership Crawford Johnson & Co aforesaid, and that deponent held the legaltitle to said property for the use and benefit of said partnership.
