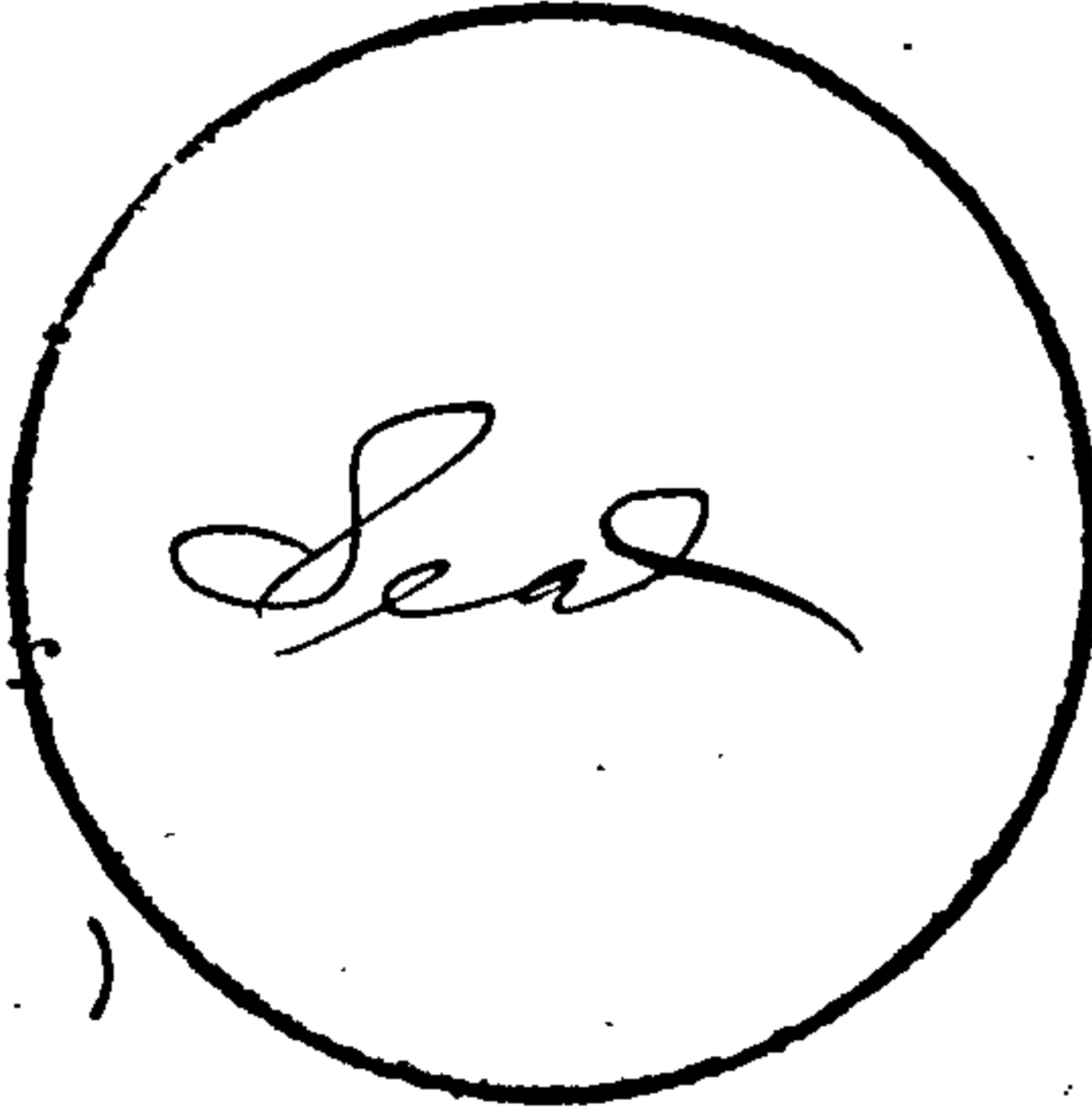
THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME GREETING:

Whereas, a certificate of the Register of the land office at Montgomery, Alabama, has been deposited in the General Land Office whereby it appears that pursuant to the Act of Congress of May 20, 1862, "To Secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain" and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Hardinia B. Howie, has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law for the southwest quarter of the southwest quarter of Section six in Township twenty south of Range two west of the Huntsville Meridian, Alabama, containing forty acres, according to the official plat of the Survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor-General:

NOW KNOW YE, that there is, therefore, granted by the United States, unto the said claimant the tract of land above described; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said claimant and to the heirs and assigns of the said claimant forever.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I, Calvin Coolidge President of the United States of America, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed. Given under my hand, in the District of Columbia, the twenty eighth day of December, in the year of our Lord One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty Five and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and fiftieth.
