Weldon, which deed is dated July 23, 1914, and recorded in Deed Book 59, page 555, in the Office of the Judge of Probate of Shelby County, Alabama, and that he, C. T. Weldon further deposes and says that at the time the above described deed was made that his mother was dead and that his father, R.G. Weldon, was a widower.

Deponent further states that his father, R.G. Weldon, bought the following described property, from W.R. Self and wife, T.E. Self in the year 1899, one lot or parcel of land beginning at the SE corner of lot sold to N.H. Self by W.H. Taylor in the Town of Wilsonville, Shelby County, Alabama and thence running North 80 feet; thence West 200 feet; thence South 80 feet; thence East 200 feet to the point of beginning, being a part of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 1, Township 21, Range 1 East, Shelby County, Alabama, immediately taking possession of same, and he, the deponent and his father continuously resided upon said property occupying the same as their home and that he and his father have had open notorious and undisputed possession of said property for more than twenty seven years, until he, C.T.
