Whereas there as been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Montgomery Alabama, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure Homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Clement Davis Junior has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law for the South half of the South East quarter of Section thirty six in Township twenty South of Range two West of Huntsville Meridian in Alabama. Containing eightyen acres and nine hundreths of an acre according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General.

Now know ye, That there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said Clement Davis Junior the tract of Land above described: To Have And To Hold the said tract of Land with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Clement Davis Junior and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof I, Benjamin Harrison President of the United States of America have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
