Taylor who is known to me, and who being by me first duly sworn, deposes and says that he is acquainted with the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 10, Township 20, Range 1 east, Shelby County, Alabama; that a few years prior to 1911 affiant and his brother George Taylor, purchased the above described forty acre tract of land from J. M. Baldwin who entered it and who had procured a Patent thereto; that said Baldwin and his wife executed and delivered to affiant and said George Taylor a good and sufficient warranty deed, conveying said land to them; that about the year 1911, as well as affiant can remember and recollect, he and his brother George Taylor executed and delivered to J.W. Tumlin and W. L.
