Horton according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Acting making further provision for the sale of the public lands", for the southwest quarter of the southwest quarter of Section eighteen in Township twenty two of range one west and the south half of the southeast quarter of Section Thirteen and the north half of the northeast quarter of Section twenty four in Township twenty two of Range two west inthe District of Lands subject to sale at Tuscaloosa, Alabama, containing two hundred and one acres and eighteen and a half hundredths of an acre according to the official plat of the Survey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tracts have been purchased by the said Jonathan J. Horton.

Horton and to his heirs and assigns forever.
