This deed is given for the purpose of acknowledging in full the payment of a \$1350 (Thirteen Hundred and Fifty Dollar) mortgage dated Dec. 8, 1925 and referred to in the deed executed by Omer Brasher and wife Lela J. Brasher to Ben J.
