LAST WILLAND TESTAMENT OF NODIAH WOODRUFF

THE STATE OF ALABAMA

DALLAS COUNTY) IN THE MAME OF GOD AMEN:

I Noadiah Woodruff, of the County and State aforesaid, being of sound mind and memory, do make, publish and declare this my last will and testament.

First: I require my executrix, hereinafter named, to pay all my just debts, if I should owe any at the time of my death, as soon as it may be proper to do so.

SECOND: I give, devise and bequeath to my beloved daughter, Etta, my plantation, lying in Pallas and Perry Counties, Alabama, known as the Walker place, and containing 1900 acres of land, and all the mules, horses, cattle, implements, cotton and corn and allother personal property thereon and belonging thereto, necessary for carrying on said plantation of what kind soever. In the event of the death of my daughter (said) without issue before the death of her mother, then said plantation I devise and bequeath to her said mother for and during the term of her natural life, and at her death said plantation shall descend and I hereby devise and bequeath the same to the children of my sister Mrs. Julia Clark, share and share alike.

THE D: All the rest and residue and remainder of my estate, I give, devise, and bequeath unto my beloved wife Sallie E. Woodruff absolutely whether the same be real personal or mixed property, with full control, of the same during her natural life and at her death, I give, devise, and bequeath whatever maybe left to my daughter Etta, or her heirs,

FOURTH: It is my wish and desire that the business of my partnership of Woodruff & North be gradually closed up as soon as it is safe to do so, and that it be done within 2 years, and I desire it not to be continued beyond two years for this purpose.

FIFTH: I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my beloved wife, Sallie E. Woodruff the executrix of this my last Will and Testament with full power to sell any of the property of my estate except the said "alker place, for the purpose of administration and payment of debts. I also nominate, constitute and appoint my said wife the guardian of the person and property of my daughter Etta, and I hereby exempt her from giving bond as such administratrix, and as such guardian.

SIXTH: I give, devise and bequeath to my cousin, E.W.North, the house and lot in which he lives at Montevallo, Alabama.
