Before me L.H. Ellis, a Notary Public in and for said County insaid State, personally appeared W. J. Weldon, who, being by me first duly sworn, deposes and says that he is acquainted with the following described real estate situated in the Town of "Wilsonville" Shelby County, Alabama viz:

For a point of beginning commence at the SE corner of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 1 Township 21, Range 1 east, and run thence south 87 degrees 30 min. west 420 feet to the NE corner of the present public school lot, thence run south 87 degrees 30 minutes west 66 feet, thence north 2 degrees 30 min. west 360 feet, thence north 87 degrees 30 minutes east 266 feet, thence south 2 degrees 30 minutes east 150 feet thence south 87 degrees 30 minutes west 210 feet, thence south 2 degrees 30 minutes east 210 feet to point of beginning, containing 1.2 acres more or less.

Further deposing affiant says tha he has known said lot above described for more than forty years and that E. W. Holland, who obtained a deed to the northeast quarter of the northeast quarter of Section 1, Township 21 Range 1 east, Shelby County, Alabama, on January 13, 1886, which deed is recorded in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama in Deed Book 90 at page 399 was in the actual possession of said lot above described for more than forty years or more before his death, which occurred on the 17th day of March 1929; that practically all of said lot was under pasture fence and was used by said Holland as a pasture for more than twenty years during said period aforesaid, and said Holland for more than twenty years prior to his death was in the actual, open, notorious, continuous, exclusive, adverse possession of said lot, claiming to own the same, and thus continued in such possession claiming to own said lot until the time of his death and since his death Miss Perdie G. Holland, the sole and only surviving heir of said E. W. Holland, was in such possession of said lot claiming to own the same until she deeded it to the State of Alabama, on June the 7th 1930.

Further deposing affiant says that he is also acquainted with the following described real estate situated in the town of Wilsonville, Shelby County, Alabama and known as the "school lot" viz:

Commencing at the southeast corner of the northeast quarter of the northeast quarter of Section 1, Township 21, Range 1 east, and running thence south 87 degrees 30 minutes west 420 feet to a starting point, which is also the north west corner of what is known as the Methodist Church lot, running thence south 2 degrees 30 minutes east 225 feet, thence south 87 degrees 30 minutes west 276 feet, thence north 2 degrees 20 minutes west 225 feet, thence north 87 degrees 30 minutes east 276 feet to the point of beginning.

Further deposing affiant says that the lot hereinabove described is the same lot which was deeded by M. E. Taylor and W. H. Taylor on the 28th day of October, 1889, which deed is recorded in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama, in deed book 41 at page 27.

Further deposing affiant says that said lot above described as been in the possession of the school trustees in and for the town of "Wilsonville, Alabama, since the date of said Taylor deed, and has been actually occupied and used all of said time down to the present time, by the public school authorities, and is the same lot upon which the present public school is now located and upon which said public school building has been located for the last forty years.
