Pitts, who is known to me, and who, being by me first duly sworn, deposes and says that he was personally acquainted with C. W. O'Hara, to whom, on the 2nd day of January, 1905, was executed a Guardian's deed, as shown by deed recorded in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama, in deed book 31 at page 487.

Further deposing affiant says that said C. W. O'Hara died January 29 1924 and that his sole surviving heirs were R. H. O'Hara, Ida V. O'Hara, Walter T. O'Hara, James Riley O'Hara and J. William O'Hara.

Further deposing affiant says that three or four months prior to September, 1911, C. W. O'Hara, who was then a widower, executed and delivered to R. H. O'Hara, Ida V. O'Hara and affiant a warranty deed, in which was conveyed in due form the same land as was by said R. H. O'Hara, Ida V. O'Hara and J. B. Pitts conveyed to W. W. Hadaway by deed executed in September 1911, and recorded in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama, in deed book 49 at page 140, but what has become of said deed affiant does not know, but he does know that said deed was executed and delivered to said parties aforementioned.
