PERSONALLY APPEARED before me, the undersigned authority, in and for said State and County, Mrs. Zeola Mooney, widow of J.C. Mooney, who being by me duly sworn deposes and says that prior to and in the year 1911, she and her husband, J.C. Mooney owned and resided on a certain piece of land at or near Wilsonville in Shelby County, Alabama, which on the South, adjoined the property then owned byH.E.Smith, and which bordered the public road, and which Smith property is now occupied by Mr. Bell; that the property formerly owned by affiant and her husband is South of the property formerly owned by H.EL. Smith and is now owned by M.D. Malcomb, and also borders on the public road which rums! North and South; that in January 1911, to her best recollection, her husband and H.E. Smith made and interchange of certain property as follows: H.E.Smith traded to the said J.C. Mooney and affiant from his property a piece of land triangular in shape on the east of said road and on the western side of his property, which piece of land so traded is described as follows: Begin at the intersection of the east line of said road with the line dividing his from the Mooney property or now the Bell property from the Malcomb property; thence run North along the east line of said public road about 80 feet to an oak tree; thence run along a line in a southeasterly direction to a point on the aforesaid dividing line between the Bell place and the Malcomb place 75 feet from the intersection of said dividing line with the east line of said public road, which is the point of beginning; then West along said dividing line about 75 feet to the point of beginning; then-in exchange for the above described property, the said J.C. Mooney and affiant traded to H. E. Smith a strip of land described as follows:

Begin at the intersection of the south lune dividing the Bell and Malcomb property with the original east line dividing said property before the exchange was made; thence run in a northerly direction along said original line about 200 myards; thence run in a southeasterly direction along a line to a point about 75 feet east of the beginning point and on the south dividing line if extended; thence run west in a straight line to the point of Reginning, the same being a triangle, the sides of which are about 200 yards and 75 feet respectively. Affiant further says that immediately after this trade was made a wire fence was placed along the lines constituting the hypotenuses of these triangles and these lines, ever since the trade was made; have always been regarded by the owners of the respective pieces of property, as the true dividing lines of the properties; that J.C. Mooney and affiant took possession of the piece of land H.F. Smith traded them and H.F. Smith took possession of the piece of land Affiant and her husband traded him; that the said J.C. Mooney and affiant, and their successors in title have occupied the land traded them from 1911 when the trade was made up to the present time, and have had possession of same for that length of time; that H.F.Smith has had possession of the piece of land the said J.C. Mooney and affiant owned and traded him since the trade an 1911 up to the time when he sold same, and his successors in title/have had possession ever since .
