

AFFIDAVIT

Before me, the undersigned authority in and for said County, in said State, personally appeared J W Moore Jr., Known to me, who being by me first duly sworn, on oath, deposes and says that he is 53 years of age and has resided in Shelby County, Alabama, for a period of 53 years and is familiar with SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 20, Tp. 19, Range 1 East, located in Shelby County, Alabama, that affiant lives about 1/4 mile from said property and has lived there for 53 years; that he knows W.J. Sewell and L.J. Sewell, who was his wife, and that on May 17, 1907, said W.J. Sewell, and his wife, L.J. Sewell, deeded said property to A.C. Sewell and C.M. Sewell and W.J. Sewell and wife L.J. Sewell had possession of said property prior to May 17, 1907, and since they conveyed same to A C Sewell, and C.M. Sewell, the latter have had continuous, open, notorious and adverse possession of said property and that since 1907 the property has always been regarded as belonging to A.C. Sewell, and C.M. Sewell, up until 1917 when they conveyed the same to W.E. Sewell who had continuous, open, notorious and adverse possession of said property until February 8th, 1919, when he and his wife, Mattie L. Sewell conveyed said property to W.R. Hughes; since February 8th, 1919, said W.R. Hughes has held open, adverse, open and notorious possession of said property and affiant has never heard the title of the Sewells or W.R. Hughes disputed. Affiant further states that C.M. Sewell and Callie Sewell are one and the same person, she being the wife of A.C. Sewell.
