I remember the occasion when said deed was executed and I knownof my own personal knowledged that it was executed and delivered on December 5th, 1919, and that immediately thereafter my husband, the said J.F. Hill, and myself and our family moved on to this property and took possession of a house located thereon, We continued to live on on said property during my husband's lifetime, and since his detath I have lived thereon up to the present time. During the entire period of time from December 1919, up to my husband's death my husband and myself and other members of his family held open, no torious, continuous, exclusive: peacesul and adverse possession of said property, using same as a home and cultivating part of it andpaying taxes on same. Our possession was never interrupted and my husband continuously claimed to own said property and asserted acts of dominion. over same. My husband, the said J.F. Hill, died on or about the 25 day of July 1927 Heaving

no last will and testament. Hy husband owed no debts at the time of his death except perhaps some small debts which have long since been paid. At the time my busband died, he left surviving him the following children: Mrs Essie Hill Chappel, who is now married to Hiles Chappell: Mrs Lula Hill Barnett; who is now married to Nolan Barnett; Office Hidl; Onnie Hill; John Hill. Leon Hidl, who is now married to Alma Lee Hill; Howard Hill, who is now married to Elizabeth H. Hill; and Mamie Hill, who is now unmarried. The above de-

scribed children are also my children, and I know that the said J.F.Hill, left no other children, nor any ahildren of a deceased child. All of the above children of J.F.Hill

are now over the age of twenty-one years, and were over twenty one years of age on January, 21,1923. Just prior to my husband's death he sold that part of the Southeastquarter ( $SE^{\frac{1}{4}}$ ) of the Northeast quarter ( $NE^{\frac{1}{4}}$ ), and that part of the  $NE^{\frac{1}{4}}$  of the  $NE^{\frac{1}{4}}$  of the  $SE^{\frac{1}{4}}$  of the above described property, which lies East of the Ferry road, said parcel containing

Miss Kate Gwin was also known as Miss Kate L Gwin, and I know of my own knowledge that she was unmarried during the month of December, 1919, and that she is still unmarried. At the time mf said deed from Miss Kate Gwin to J.F.Hill was executed, to-wit, during the monthbof December, 1919, Miss Kate Gwin was living on the property conveyed by said deed, and I know that she had been liwing on said property holding and occupying same for several years prior to 1919. I knew during her lifetime Ida F Gwin, who died about the year 19---. I know that George H. Gwin, Peter K. Gwin, James B. Gwin, Adrian V. Gwin, Nellie G. Marable, Lucy G. Hebb, John L. Gwin, W.S. Gwin, and

Kate L Gwin were all of the heirs of the said Ida E. Gwin.
