

## AFFIDAVIT

Before me G W Nash, a Notary Public in and for said County in said State, personally appeared Geo M Baker, who being by me first duly sworn deposes on oath and says: My name is George M. Baker, and I am 56 years of age. For the past 40 years I have lived in the vicinity of and been familiar with the nature of the ownership and possession of that part of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of section 1 Township 21 Range 1 East, lying South and East of the Montgomery Wagon Road. This property was formerly known as the W S Gwin residence, and was conveyed by Miss Kate Gwin to Mr J.F.Hill by deed dated December, 1919 and recorded in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama, in Volume 66, Record of Deeds, at page 308. At the time said deed was made Miss Kate Gwin was living on said property and immediately delivered possession thereof to J.F.Hill. The said J.F.Hill moved on said property and occupied same with his family, holding open, notorious, continuous, exclusive, peaceful and adverse possession of same from December, 1919, until the year 1927, when he died. I know that he left no children other than Mrs. Essie Hill Chappell, Mrs. Lenla Hill Barnett, Offie Hill, Onnie Hill, John Hill, Leon Hill, Howard Hill and Mamie Hill. I further know that after the death of the said J.F.Hill, Mrs J.F.Hill and some of the children of J.F.Hill continued to live on said property and have held open, notorious, continuous, exclusive, peaceful and adverse possession of same up to the present time, claiming same as their own. I have never heard of any claim being made adverse to that of said J.F.Hill, and of Mrs. J.F.Hill, and the heirs of said J.F.Hill.
