agreeing to pay the taxes thereupon when same have been heard and determined by this court.

The court having been informed in the premises is of the opinion that the offer of the purchaser, L.A. Christian, should be accepted, and that said sale should be had and confirmed, and now no adverse interest appearing, it is by the Court ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND

l. That R.H. Eggleston, as trustee in bankruptcy of the estate of A.H. Brockman, Bankrupt, deliver over to L.A.
