Crumpton, who executed a deed to Henry Milner on March the 8th, 1907, which deed is recorded in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama, in deed book 35, at page 178.

Further deposing affiant says that he was acquainted with said G.W.Crumpton for a number of years prior to his death, and while he lived on the land

Further deposing affiant says that George W. Crumpton is one and the same person as George W. Crumpton, whose estate was administered in the Probate Court of Shelby County, Alabama, wherein L.M. Templin was Administered, and in which administration some of the land now owhed by affiant was involved.

Further deposing affiant says that while the deed from Claudie C. Jones to him (he being the same as Jesse Benjamin King), recites that a portion of the consideration for the execution of said deed is evidenced by four notes for \$250. O each, yeat this unpaid balance of the purchase price was secured and evidenced by a mortgage executed by him to said Claudie C. Jones, which mortgage is recorded in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama, in mortgage book 143 at page 581, and that there is now a balance due on said mortgage of four hundred and sixty four dollars, and the money which he will obtain through the present proceedings for a loan from the Federal Land Bank will be used to satisfy and discharge this mortgage debt which will in turn of course satisfy the debt recited in the deed above referred to, which deed is dated February 1, 1926, and is recorded in the Probate Office of

Shelby County, in deed book 80 at Bage 123,

Further deposing affiant says that he is the owner of that portion of the south east quarter of the north east quarter of Section 20, Township 21, Range 1 Fast, Shelby County, Alabama, lying north and east of Beeswax Creek, and Emma Davis, who executed ralded to Alabama Power Company to amright of way across said forty acre tract/is unknown to him; that affiant has been knowing this forty acre tract of land for fifteen years or more and during none of that time has the said Emma Davis advanced any claim of ownership to any portion thereof, nor has she been in possession of same, but that affiant and those through whom he claims title to said land have been in the open, notorious, continuous, exclusive, adverse possession of said land for more than twenty years, The Davis deed referred to is dated May 15, 1922, and is recorded in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama, in deed book 72, at page 115. The Davis deed is evidently erroneous as to description because said Emma Davis has no interest in said land and is not known in that section of the country at all.

Christian of date January 25, 1901, and recorded in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama, in deed book 33 at page 470, he claims only the surface right and there is no conflict between him and the J.P.Christian heirs as to the surface rights, and that to the best of his knowledge the heirs of said J.P.Christian own the mineral rights to said land, while he owns the surface rights and his surface rights are uncontroverted and uncontestable and unclaimed either by the heirs of J.P.Christian or any one else, nor have the heirs of said J.P.Christian, deceased, had or claimed any possessions of the surface of said land, nor did said J.P.Christian, during his life time.
